1, Skell Ghyll (00) Trainshed Group Layout

This new project shows what a preserved railway in the Lake District might look like. The Group have imagined a railway along the Langdale Valley opened in the late 19th Century and subsequently closed in the 1960's only to be re-opened by enthusiasts

2, Rectory Farm Sidings (00) S Grantham

A scene from the blue diesel period of British Rail

3, Annerley (N) D Harrison Trainshed

A Summer Saturday in the 1960's on the East Yorkshire Coast. The layout shows the railway line deviating out on to Flamborough Head. All the scenes and buildings on the layout are based on features found on the Headland. The rolling stock is typical of the period.

4, Kinlochewe (00) N.O.E.L. Railway Modellers

Set in the 1970's/80's this is a "what might have been" Scottish Branch line leaving the Kyle line at Achnasheen. Services are diesel hauled with appropriate freight and passenger rolling stock

5, Crioch (EM) P Fletcher

This compact layout was designed for the display and operation of a collection of Highland Locomotives. Today it is being operated in the green diesel era of British Rail. The layout represents a station on the Inverness and Ross-shire Railway

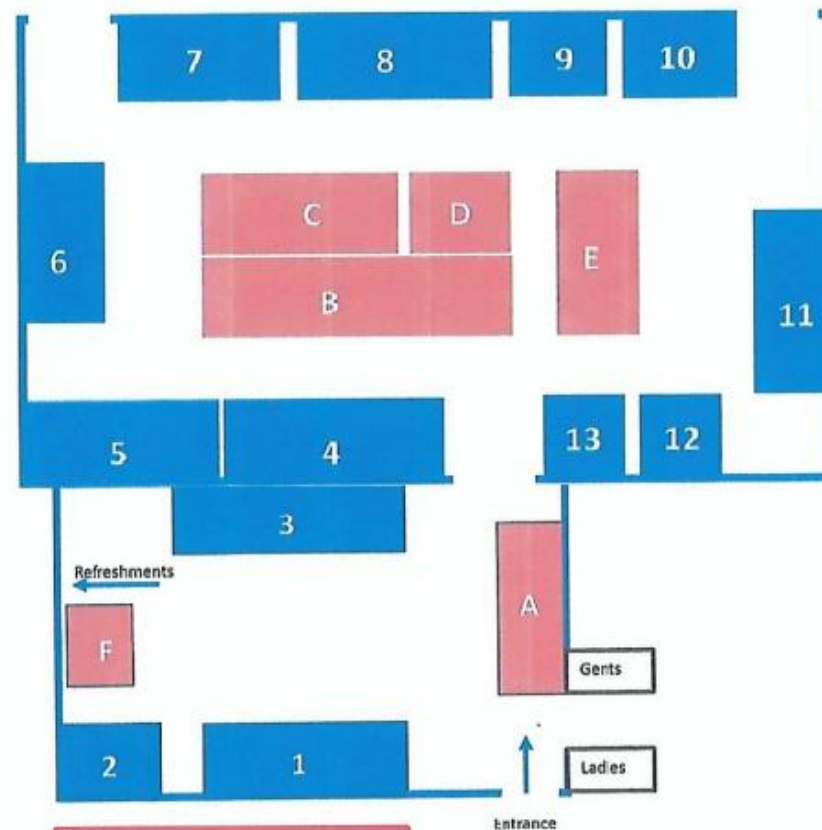
6, The Brick (00) C Martin

Based on the Bricklayers Arms in South East London, which closed in 1981, the layout depicts an imaginary scene as if some of the site had remained open to this day. It shows a four road MPD, an oil depot and a steel fabrication factory.

7, Sowerby Station (O) A Waudby R Coultard

The southern terminus of the Thirsk and Sowerby Light Railway and the location of the engineering firm JD Metals. The trackwork is Peco and the locomotives are proprietary items from well-known manufacturers. Please ask the operators for more information.

8, Hollym Gate (00) B Sunman , Hull MRS,
A station on the Hull to Withernsea line. It is imagined that the line remained open until the 1960's. All the buildings have been scratch built and are based on examples found along the line.

9, St Cath's (N) S Taylor, Carlton MRS

This layout is based in Lincolnshire in the 1960's and early 1970's and lies on the line between Grimsby /Immingham in the north and Boston and the rail network to the south.

10, Arfer Yard, 7mm Narrow Gauge M Surr

Based on an industrial yard outside a small rural town in the late 1950's. The Loco's move goods in and out of the yard, which has an agricultural supplier, a joinery business and general warehousing. Loco's are kit built and buildings are scratch built.

11, Tyskie-Wielkopolska (HO) A Wardman

A small country station set in the west of Poland. There is a goods yard and timber loading point. Most of the stock and Loco's are from the Piko and Roco ranges.

12, Wayside USA (N) G Hand

Built to display a collection of Santa Fe stock from the 1970's era. It is meant to represent the edge of a typical western small-town dependent on quarrying for its livelihood. Almost all the trains are freight, the passenger service being provided by a Budd RDC.

13. Zetland (Z) T Fowler

The layout features rolling stock by Märklin. Built by members of Oxford modellers it shows loco's from the 1960's.
