
## Layouts

- 1, Rectory Farm Sidings. 00 gauge, S Grantham Making a return this year but in a different guise. The layout is now depicting a B.R. scene.
- 2, Napier Road. O gauge. Scarborough & DRM This a fictitious layout set in the early 1960's in the North Eastern Region of British Railways. Steam as well as diesel loco's are in operation
- 3, Americana HO gauge. A Wardman
  The layout is set somewhere in the USA based
  around a small switching yard with a cement loading
  plant.
- 4, La Camrienne. HO gauge . G Hand
  This layout represents a French light railway almost
  at the end of its life. There is some passenger traffic
  along with some agricultural freight movements.
  The local wine bottling plant also contributes to the
  rail traffic.
- 5,Coal Hill West N gauge. C Berry Hull MRS
  Set on the fictional Chedder Valley Railway in
  Somerset. It is a small main line terminus that
  serves First Great Western services to Bristol and
  Yatton.
- 6, Megsdorf. HO gauge. N Raven
  A small station in southern Germany covered in snow. There is a freight siding and a private gated siding serving a brewery and a small factory.
- 7, Builder's Yard. O gauge. J Lane
  A small compact layout showing that it is not always necessary to have a large layout in order to model in O gauge.
- 8, Garside. Gauge 1. C Bell Live Steam Shown here are the Garside engine sheds and wharf station. Look out for the working dioramas, welding repair man, camera flashing train spotters, the smoking barbecue and many more.

- 9, T track. N Gauge Yorkshire Area N Gauge Group A demonstration of how modules built by different individuals can be connected to make a larger layout.
- **10, Alexander Yard.** N Gauge. S Barraclough A small layout in a small scale showing what can be achieved in a small space.
- 11 West Street Station. 00 gauge. S Taylor A suburban station featuring single and two car DMU's operating passenger services. On the other side of the level crossing there are two sidings with loco's picking up and dropping off wagons.
- 12 Serendipity. 00 gauge. C Martin
  A fantasy layout to delight children. There are features that will amuse adults. Look out for the skating penguins and the fairytale village.
- 13 Skell Ghyll. 00 gauge. Trainshed MRG This is what a preserved railway in the lake District might look like. The group have imagined a railway along the Langdale valley, opened in the late 19th century and subsequently closed in the 1960's only to be reopened by enthusiasts. This is an on going project and it has been extended since it was last exhibited.
